







Nova Scotia community foundations provide \$430,187 to community-led infrastructure projects as part of the Government of Canada's Healthy Communities Initiative

HALIFAX, NS – The Community Foundation of Nova Scotia, Rural Communities Foundation of Nova Scotia, and Ulnooweg Indigenous Communities Foundation, along with Jaime Battiste, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations and Member of Parliament for Sydney-Victoria, today announced \$430,187 for seven community-led projects as part of the Canada Healthy Communities Initiative.

Through the \$60-million Healthy Communities Initiative, the Government of Canada, alongside Community Foundations of Canada, is building safer spaces and ensuring a higher quality of life for people across the country by helping communities adapt to the continued challenges presented by COVID-19. From community gardens and activity spaces to digital infrastructure, the funding is allowing organizations to adapt programs and services to keep residents safe and healthy, support economic recovery, create jobs, and build vibrant, resilient communities.

- The Canada Healthy Communities Initiative was created to help communities adapt to the COVID-19
 pandemic and create safe ways for residents to access services and enjoy the outdoors.
- The initiative was designed to fund eligible projects between \$5,000 and \$250,000 under three main themes: creating safe and vibrant public spaces, improving mobility options and digital solutions.
