

Applications now being accepted from organizations offering health and wellness services in the Tri-County area

YARMOUTH, NS – Community organizations offering health and wellness services and activities in the Yarmouth, Digby and Shelburne areas are encouraged to apply to the Reciprocity Health Fund. The Fund supports community-based projects addressing the social determinants of health – the living conditions people experience that influence a wide range of health outcomes and risks.

In 2022, the first year of the program, seven organizations were granted over \$200,000 to support community-based health initiatives. Administered by the Community Foundation of Nova Scotia through a call for proposals, the Reciprocity Health Fund is funded by an anonymous donor wishing to have a positive impact on the health of people in the Tri-County area.

"The Reciprocity Health Fund is committed to improving the quality of life for those living in the Tri-County area while building capacity at the local level. We are proud to administer a fund and granting program that takes a local approach to addressing the health and wellness needs of these communities in a sustainable, impactful way," said Daniel Holland, CEO, Community Foundation of Nova Scotia.

Quick Facts

- Some of the many social determinants of health include food insecurity, income, education, employment, housing, social inclusion, geography, early childhood development, gender, and access to health and social services.
- Projects should focus on improving health outcomes and reducing health inequities; are to be delivered in Shelburne, Yarmouth and/or Digby counties; and must be led by or partnered with a qualified organization such as a registered charity, municipality, or postsecondary institution.

• Grants may be awarded for multi-year projects with plans outlining ongoing evaluation and long-term viability.
